

Conduct quantitative analysis and market research that supports health system strategic decision-making, operational performance, and financial viability. Experienced in developing demand and financial forecast models for health services across the continuum of care, measuring the impact of organizational actions and strategic initiatives, business plan development, and providing analytic support for payer negotiations and health law expert reports.

- Preparation of integrated strategic and financial plans for current and proposed services and programs. Conduct competitor analysis, demographic research, portfolio analysis, valuation estimates, risk assessment, and simulation modeling. Perform sensitivity tests of utilization and financial models, both for current business operations and proposed strategic initiatives.
- Preparation of forecast models and supporting executive reports, translating raw internal data and external market data into specific actions and specific resource allocation recommendations. Projects include identifying expansion or new program development opportunities for ambulatory surgery centers, neonate intensive care units, general hospital acute care, inpatient rehabilitation care, inpatient psychiatric care, kidney dialysis, and other health services and programs.

Assist in literature review; research and integration of appropriate databases; data processing, modeling, and visualization; and drafting reports communicating methodology and key findings. In situations where data from defendant and plaintiff is limited or otherwise not available, able to design, develop, and apply secondary survey analysis to estimate prevalence, utilization, expenditures, and overall economic damages.
- Preparation of valuation studies requiring assessment of "fair market value." This has included contractual arrangements, where buyers must meet the fair market value standard for federal statutes, and preparation of fair market value estimates of physician compensation and clinic practices.

- Client support in assessment of the financial impact of payer reimbursement proposals, ranging from partial updates of existing agreement terms to complete revisions of reimbursement plans. Performance of sensitivity analysis and contract review to inform counterproposal recommendations.
- Modeling health care utilization and financial performance for health services at multiple levels of analysis, including systems-level, regional, organizational, service line, provider, and patient. Ability to utilize clinical, financial, and population data sets to assess historical experience and outcomes and develop demand and financial projections.
- Employ knowledge of applied statistical and health econometric methods, including applied survey analysis, time series forecasting, generalized linear models, Monte Carlo simulation, and predictive modeling.
- Manage full life cycle of Certificate of Need ("CON") applications. Serve as CON subject matter expert and manage interdisciplinary team from strategy, business development, operations, finance, and facilities / real estate departments.
